

LEADmissions Rules & Policies

Our group understands and commits to the following:

- All sessions and meetings are mandatory. If there is any reason why a student cannot attend, please notify the Point Leader.
- Everyone will be housed in local churches and you will need to bring sleeping bags and Twin-sized (only) air mattresses to sleep on.
- No boys allowed in girls' sleeping area and vice versa.
- No alcohol, drugs or tobacco of any kind. LEADmissions has a strict zero tolerance policy and students and/or leaders will be sent home at your group's expense.
- Each group is responsible for all transportation to and from the event, to and from daily ministry/work sites, and for the Free Day Activities. Please plan accordingly for gas expenses and/or rental vehicles (if needed).
- LEADmissions has a 'No Leaving Base Camp' policy. Once students arrive at their host accommodations they should not leave unless it is for the daily ministry/work sites or any official Team/Group activity.
- All scheduled times, including lights out, are to be followed by each group.
- Each team is responsible for all medical emergencies within their group as there is no nurse on staff at LEADmissions. Medical release forms need to be kept with the team leader at all times. At registration, each team will be given maps and phone numbers to the closest medical facilities.
 - If, due to illness, it becomes necessary for a student to remain behind at the host facility during the ministry/work periods or other activities, a team leader (at least 18 years old) must stay with them and the LEADmissions staff notified.
- LEADmissions and the host facility are not responsible for any lost or stolen items during any part of this trip.
- Each team must bring a minimum of one leader (19 years of age or older) for every ten students (per gender).
- Each student needs to bring a water bottle for use during the week.
- Participants are encouraged to combine daily worksite items into one backpack. Suggested items include: cameras, work gloves, sunscreen, water bottle and hat.
- Each domestic trip group needs to bring 1 large cooler and 2 freezer packs for lunches at the ministry/work sites. If you have more than 15 on your team, please bring more coolers/freezer packs.
- Students may want to bring additional money for the Free Day or to purchase souvenirs or items from local stores.
- All students must be in their assigned sleeping areas by designated times.
- Before your arrival all forms must be sent to Gloria.
